PROVE-UP CHECKLISTS FOR THE DOMESTIC RELATIONS DIVISION OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF COOK COUNTY

A prove-up is when at least the Petitioner, and sometimes the Respondent, appears in front of a judge to finalize their divorce case. A prove-up is the final step in a divorce case and is mandatory in Illinois. The party or parties who will be attending the prove-up in their case must have certain documents in order to complete their divorce case.

The following checklists are designed to help you prepare for prove-up in the Domestic Relations Division of the Circuit Court of Cook County. *Please note that not all judges require every document listed on the checklist, and some judges may require additional documents that you will be asked to complete in the courtroom the day of your prove-up.* The checklist that you use depends on which type of case you have, so please select only one of the checklist options on the following pages.

Special Considerations for Parties with Minor Children

If you and your spouse have minor children together, then you will both be required to attend a parenting class prior to your prove-up. The parenting class can either be done in-person (FOCUS on Children) or online (Children in Between Online). Please note that each parenting class requires that the parties pay a fee to attend unless the parties have an approved fee waiver. Once the a parties have attended the class, then they will receive a Certificate of Completion, which they will either file or bring to court with them the day of their prove-up.

Special Considerations for Parties with Retirement Benefits

If you and/or your spouse have any retirement benefits (pension, 401k, etc.) then those benefits may be divided by your agreement or by order of the judge during your divorce. Please note that if there are retirement benefits that will be divided between the parties during the divorce, then those parties may have to prepare additional documentation, either a Qualified Domestic Relations Order (QDRO) for private retirement benefits or a Qualified Illinois Domestic Relations Order (QILDRO) for government retirement benefits. One or both of the parties may have to meet with an attorney in order to prepare the additional documentation either before or after their divorce is finalized. If the additional documentation has already been drafted, then it can be entered by the judge at the time of prove-up. However, if the additional documentation has not yet been prepared, then it can be entered by the judge at a later date.
